Pet waste left to decay on the sidewalk, grass or street may be washed into storm sewers by rain or melting snow. Storm sewers usually do not go to a sewage treatment plant, but drain directly into our waterways, carrying pet waste with it.



Pet waste may carry disease-causing organisms, which make water unsafe for swimming or drinking.



Pet waste contains nutrients that encourage weed and algae growth.



Pets, children playing outside, and adults gardening are most at risk for infection from some of the bacteria and parasites found in pet waste.
